

The Master Forest Owner program began in 1991 to provide private woodland owners of New York State with the information and encouragement necessary to manage their forest holdings wisely.

Over 140 experienced and highly motivated volunteer MFOs are available statewide, ready to assist neighbor woodland owners with the information needed to start managing their forests, through a **FREE** visit to the property.

- $\sim 61\%$ of NYS land area is ~ 19 million acres of forest land
 - \sim 74% of NY forests are owned by private landowners.

- These private forest lands provide many public benefits including clean air and water, carbon storage, forest products, jobs, scenic beauty, and outdoor recreation opportunities.




Our Goal

- Free Resources from CCE & Partners




What is a MFO Woods Walk?
